

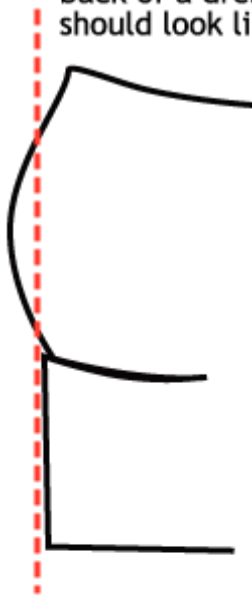
HOW TO PROPERLY FIT A WEDGE (OR WEDGIE)

Popular in the 1940's and revived in the 1970's, these are women's shoes, often open toed and open backed, that have a one-piece sole that is shaped like a wedge. They can be slip on, lace up or buckled.

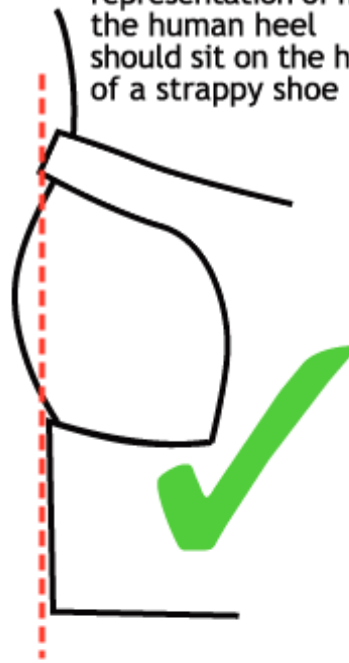
Below are some very simple drawings that demonstrate the most difficult concept to grasp in fitting women's strappy shoes... the fact that if your foot is too far into the shoe at the back, you'll look like a 4-yearold standing in the mirror trying on mommy's shoes.



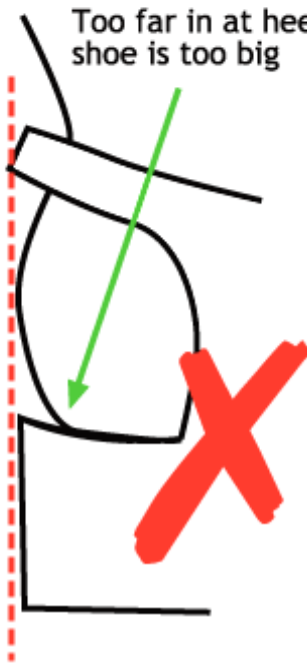
This is a primitive representation of what the heel on the back of a dress shoe should look like



This is a primitive representation of how the human heel should sit on the heel of a strappy shoe



Too far in at heel = shoe is too big



Too far beyond back of shoe heel = shoe is too small
